



STUDIO DRESS CODE

We strongly enforce our dress code at DISTRICT ARTS. Students not in correct attire may be asked to sit out of classes and not be allowed to participate. Having a dress code helps the instructors correct body alignment of the dancers and helps them see when students are not doing moves correctly. Proper dance attire also makes sure to keep dancer's safe and covered when moving.

Lil' Dancers ballet combo (ages 3-6):

- Any color leotard and skirt
- Pink, tan, or black tights
- Ballet shoes (no slippers allowed, must be ballet shoes)
- Tan or Black Jazz Shoes
- Hair must be up and out of the face, preferably in a bun

Lil' Dancers hip hop combo (ages 3-6):

- Any color leotard or fitted top
- biker shorts or dance shorts or leggings
- Sneakers
- Tan or Black Jazz Shoes
- Hair must be up and out of the face,

Ballet:

- Black Leotards with optional Pink or Black Ballet Skirt. (teens over 11 yrs old may wear black dancer shorts)
- Pink Tights (except summer months)
- Hair in Bun (no hair in the face)
- Pink Ballet Shoes
- OPTIONAL: Pink or Black Ballet Sweater [during winter months]

Breaking classes and Hip Hop:

- T-shirt (preferably DISTRICT ARTS shirt) or dance tank or crop
- Joggers or sweatpants (NO JEANS!)
- Sneaker/tennis shoes
- Absolutely no sandals or Crocs!

Jazz, Lyrical, & Contemporary:

- Black or tan Jazz Shoes (may need tan turners/half soles)
- Black Jazz Pants or Leggings or bike shorts
- Any color Leotard or dance top
- Hair pulled back in a ponytail or bun

Dancer feet & shoes care:

- Dancers should wear tights with all ballet and jazz shoes, but if not wearing tights they should wear a thin regular sock to absorb moisture in their shoes.
- Sneaker/tennis shoes must wear socks.
- To clean dance shoes from smell: let them air out once you get home, do not keep them confined to a dance bag, if needed add a small sprinkle of baking soda after use.
